- You must include relevant photographs for each topic.
- You must include at least one video and one political cartoon relevant to your theme.
- You must have at least four web pages and include at least two hyperlinks to approved relevant websites. You can check with your teacher or the librarian to check if your link is appropriate.

- Create a Story Board using a tri fold presentation board. The Story Board must include historic photos of the topic and a written paragraph of 4-5 sentences explaining each event.



- Create a Video Timeline using video, narration and music. This must include historic clips, historic photos and music. You may not create your own reenactment.

1. 1935- Congress Passes the Neutrality Acts
2. 1937- Japan Launches War against China
3. 1939- WWII begins in Europe as Hitler invades Poland
4. 1940- France surrenders to Germany
5. 1941- Japanese bomb Pearl Harbor
6. 1942- The Battle of Midway
7. 1944- D-Day
8. 1945- May, Germany surrenders VE Day
9. 1945- Hiroshima and Nagasaki
10. 1945- Japan surrenders VJ Day
11. 1945 thru 1946- The Nuremberg Trials.
